LIGHTENING LOADS! SCHOOL BAGS

To ensure the safety and convenience of our students, only standard rucksacks or backpacks are allowed for carrying school supplies. Trolley bags are prohibited as they pose a trip hazard and are unnecessary due to the limited number of books required; if brought, students will be asked to carry them as rucksacks. Personal items like toys should not be brought to avoid the distress of losing them. Please ensure school bags adhere to our rack dimensions of 35 cm in height and 16 cm in width, and bring a small lunch bag that fits within these racks.



ATTENDANCE

To ensure student success and meet our KHDA-mandated attendance goal of over 96%, promptly report absences to the Class Teacher and Phase Head. Schedule doctor or other appointments outside school hours whenever possible. For early departures, notify the Class Teacher, Phase Head, and Reception in advance, securing the Phase Head's approval and by providing any required documentation. As school starts at 7:10 am, punctuality is essential. Students arriving after 7.10 am must collect a late slip from Reception to avoid receiving an auto-generated absence notification email.

If your child will be absent for three days or more, please provide a medical certificate to the class teacher.

MOBILE PHONES & IT DEVICES

Students using electronic devices outside of the educational purpose of the classroom (including those brought in for the BYOD initiative) will have the item confiscated and it shall be returned only after two days.

PARENT PORTAL

The parent portal is an essential tool for parents to stay connected with their child's education, offering access to student profiles, academic reports, and performance indicators. It also allows parents to manage school fees and payment history. To access the portal, parents need to use this **Parent Portal Login** and the login credentials are the GR No and the DOB of the student (Eg:120912). Regularly checking the portal and updating contact information are recommended for maximizing its benefits. For support, contact the school's IT or administrative office.

SCHOOL MEDICAL DEPARTMENT

Health records of all students are maintained and kept in the School Clinic. Additionally, the school clinic provides vaccinations as per the DHA schedule. The clinic staff will communicate vaccination requirements to parents as needed. It is mandatory for all parents to email a soft copy of their child/children's vaccination record to health@dubaischolars.com at the time of admission. Health education will be provided by the medical team to all students based on topics advised by DHA.

OTHER INFORMATION

Bringing Money to the School!

Students occasionally need to bring money to school, either as a donation for charity or as payment for a trip.

It is helpful to place the money in a sealed envelope, indicating the amount, purpose and student's name on the cover.

D6 Communicator

All parents are required to download the D6 School Communicator App on their devices, as it serves as the primary platform for all school-related communication. Important updates, circulars, alert messages, and announcements will be shared exclusively through this app.

Staying connected via the D6 app ensures that parents receive timely and accurate information regarding school activities and important notices.

Administrative **Documents**

Requests for administrative documents, such as Bonafide certificates for RTA or visa purposes, should be emailed to reception@dubaischolars.com. The turnaround time for these documents is typically 48 working hours, and a fee of AED 10 per copy applies.

Birthdays and Special Occasions

We recognise that your child's birthday is a very special occasion, and you would like to celebrate it in school.

However please note that we do not allow birthday cakes to be brought to class;
Alternately you could also send a small memento such as a toy/sticker/pencil that can be given out to students by the teacher.

Summer Months

In order to ensure the wellbeing of our students, we do not take our students out to the field to play during the break time and in PE classes in the summer months. The school does have some shaded areas for students to play under during their break times.

Lost & Found

Any stray items that are found in the school will be brought to the Lost & Found Area. Please encourage your child's independence by asking them to look for any items that are lost. To avoid amassing a large amount of lost property we do ask that all items' students bring into school (including lunch boxes, pencil cases and uniform especially ties and hats) are named so that they can be easily matched with their owner.
